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Dear parent/carer,

I wanted to share with you some of the highlights from the recent GCSE and A level examination results. At key stage 5 we are pleased to report a significant increase in the number of students gaining the highest grades of A\*-A in both academic and vocational qualifications, 40% of entries achieved the top grades, a significant increase from 50% the previous year and 58% of entries were awarded A\*-B grades, again a significant increase from 50% in 2015. We wish the class of 2016 good luck as they start their higher education courses at universities such as University College London, University of Bath, University of Leicester, Kings College London, Newcastle University, Derby University, Nottingham Trent University, University of Warwick, St Andrews University and the University of York.

The College's GCSE results were equally as pleasing, with 69% of students achieving 5 A\*-C grades, including English and mathematics. The College's GCSE English results were the best in Derby City. We are delighted to welcome back a significant number of our Year 11 students into Year 12. My thanks must go to all the students, staff and parents and carers. This improvement in examination results across Key Stage 4 and 5 was most certainly a team effort!

Whilst we celebrate the results of the class of 2016 I am conscious that there is still much to do to ensure the College maintains its outstanding grading and is recognised as the flagship school in Derby City. As we move into the new academic year I thank you for your support and ask that this is maintained as we continue to move forward.

The start to the new academic year has been extremely positive. All students are looking smart and are prepared for learning with relevant equipment. Punctuality has increased significantly and I would ask that students continue to arrive on site at 8.20am each morning.
