### Year 11/Year 7 Residentials

Our Year 11 students have just returned from a very productive, enjoyable residential at Mount Cook Activity Centre near Matlock, where they began revision for their all-important GCSE examinations. Alongside revision classes on the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science, students had the chance to learn outside of the classroom – with activities including archery, fencing and high ropes. After the end of term holiday, our Year 11s will sit their first set of trial examinations, so the residential was an excellent opportunity to practise hard work, resilience and study skills in advance of the examinations.

At the start of Term 2, our Year 7 students will be attending their own residential trip – this time at Lea Green Activity Centre in the Derbyshire countryside. The focus of this visit is to build team work and collaboration with their new peers, as well as developing other key skills needed to be successful inside and outside of the classroom.
