

All students in Y9-Y11 who are studying MFL have access to this site. Their username is their College email address. If they forget their password, they can use the "Forgot your


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There are four main areas which students can access:

- **Videos** – these are arranged by topic and have a star rating, with the more stars meaning that it is a more challenging task. Each videos has a series of tasks to go with it, which students can complete using the video and then received immediate feedback on their answers:



- **Vocab** – this is divided into different topics and allows students to practise and test themselves on different blocks of words within individual topics.
- **Grammar** – this is divided into different grammatical topics, with explanations, videos and practise exercises which provide students with immediate feedback.
- **Nutty Tilez** – This is an interactive vocab game where students compete against each other (and computer bots if not enough students are online). There are 50 levels to the game, and students can only progress to the next level once they have a secure knowledge of the vocab from their current level.

This is a vocab learning site where students can access vocab learning ‘sets’ which have been created by any user on the site (which can also be useful for key terms for other subjects). Miss Reed and Mr Calow have created and arranged vocab sets for students to use, and will provide links via SMHW for students to access. There are smartphone apps for Quizlet which students can download and use.
