At Year 13 students will study in addition to the AS content:

Multiculturalism in Hispanic society:

Immigration: Learn more about immigration in Spain and discuss positive and negative aspects of immigration.

Coexistence: Learn about the ways different cultures integrate in Spain.

Aspects of political life in the Hispanic world:

Young people: Learn about and discuss political issues which affect young people in the Spanish speaking world.

The monarchy and dictatorships: Understand the impact of the dictatorship of Franco and other Latin American dictators. Look at changes to the Spanish monarchy

Popular movements: Explore the effectiveness of popular movements, protests and strikes in Spain and the Spanish speaking world.
