Curriculum Intent: Students will be introduced to a genre of theatre and make connections with how Commedia has influenced modern comedy. All AO's will be addressed in this unit.	Curriculum Intent: Students will be introduced to the work of Konstantin Stanislavski and the genre of Naturalism through a variety of texts. Students will understand rehearsal techniques and characterisation as well as how to properly stage theatre. There is a particular focus on AO2, AO3 and AO4 in this unit.	Curriculum Intent: Students will be introduced to the work of Antonin Artaud and the style of surrealism through The Theatre of Cruelty. Students will look at performance technique to complement this style but focus attention on designing and evaluating production. All AO's implemented.	Curriculum Intent: Students will be introduced to the style of Epic theatre, through the practitioner Bertolt Brecht. Students will look at text examples of Brechtian techniques and devise their own work, utilising Epic theatre conventions. All AO's are addressed in this unit.	Curriculum Intent: Students will study the work of Frantic Assembly and Gecko theatre. They will employ physical theatre rehearsal techniques to begin devising and making original theatre. All AO's are addressed in this unit.
