Well done to our Amnesty Group who raised £257 for the Disasters Emergency Committee Pakistan Floods Appeal by holding a samosa sale!




First Story

University of Derby public speaking workshop

Following the completion of their end of year exams, all Year 12 students completed a new, extended programme of activities designed to better prepare them for their futures. As part of an expanding programme of sixth form 'non-qualification activities' which will enable them to make more informed choices about their career aspirations and to succeed beyond academic achievement, all students firstly visited an Open Day at York University, a member of the prestigious Russell Group of universities. Students were able to both attend mini-lectures and talks within specific departments as well as taking a closer look at the university facilities. Following this, and despite some challenges remaining from the pandemic, we were delighted that all students secured and completed a week's 'live' external work placement, a key part of their core curriculum when they receive first-hand experience of the world of work. We were delighted to receive such positive feedback from so many placement providers about the way that our students engaged with the experience, displaying initiative, maturity, responsibility and the ability to collaborate with others. This was then followed by a series of activities within College over three days, including public speaking training, a CV writing workshop, certificated first aid training and an individual 30 minute mock interview with local external employers. Employers were effusive about how articulate and reflective our students were during their interviews, particularly when it came to understanding their own strengths and development needs and in knowing where to seek required information. In other activities, students learnt more about apprenticeships, received advice from Loughborough University about personal statements and then in tutor-led sessions, started applications to UCAS, the universities admissions body.

Students were delighted with their experience. Vlad stated "I honestly thought that the interviews we did were amazing. It got people out of their comfort zones, and it was good for everyone because everyone had at least one thing to improve on, and if you did well overall it was a big confidence boost, and if you didn't it was a great learning opportunity." He also reflected that "It's also great that [the first aid course] statistically increased the chances of someone's life being saved". Estelle commented that "The mock interviews with local employers was one of the most valuable and useful opportunities I have ever been given in my academic life. It has provided me with a unique and individual experience that has not only boosted my confidence and exposed my strengths, but has also demonstrated what is expected from me in order to succeed in my future career. I would encourage every student to take advantage of this great opportunity!" Matthew thought that "The public speaking activities helped build my teamwork and leadership skills, especially as we worked to strict deadlines; the thought-provoking and imaginative interpretations of the presentation briefs demonstrated the value of each of our unique perspectives, and helped us to understand how we all have valuable contributions to make when faced with potentially uncomfortable and difficult challenges in education and the workplace."

Some of the Gods that students created included Timo the God of time, Daria the God of dreams, Sinthia the God of nature and even the God of Pizza!


Well done to all those students who took part and thank you to Alex for working with our students.


Roald Dahl Day




The Winter Fair

Breath taking landscapes.






Oceans flooded by plastics

Basketball at Landau

LFC football update

Y7 boys have so far only been fortunate enough to compete in one tournament, however have had fantastic numbers training with 28+ students, consistently attending. At the tournament, we played five matches, winning three, drawing one and losing a tight affair 2-1. The matches won, we were prolific in front of goal, scoring multiple goals in each game.

Girls in Y7 & Y8 attended a full day, 10 team tournament. It saw Y8 achieve 5th place, missing 4th place by one point. The Y8 team had success in the number of goals scored and were very close to progressing to the next round. Both years have shown incredible developments in their football ability throughout the tournament. Y7 and Y8 showed determination, fantastic teamwork and had a brilliant day of football.

Y8 boys have had a successful year so far. They have had some excellent results, with the highlight being a win against St Benedict's. The team were 3-0 down and went on to win 9-6, with Izach scoring 7 goals in a terrific performance. Y8 are also through to the second round of the County Cup. The team have a good chance of being promoted through the play offs if performances remain consistent.
