# Sixth Form at LFCD

This term has seen our sixth form students experiencing another broad set of Non-Qualification Activities, complementing their A level studies.

One of the highlights of the year are the workshops presented by visitors from Zebra Red who bring into sharp focus the issues of discrimination, extremism and hate crime. Again this year, the delivery was intense, honest, at times humorous but always deeply thought provoking; both students and staff are typically left deeply moved, not least because of the enduring message of hope that underpins the talks, largely derived from the speakers' own experiences. Students were again engaged and inspired by what they heard and have again found this to be the stimulus for much deep reflection and wider debate.

Careers have again been a focus this term, highlighted by the annual Careers Fair held in November. Representation from twelve local, national and global employers, including Rolls Royce, JCB and Siemens, provided much valuable information to our students to reflect on. This major event has been accompanied by individual visitors this term with students considering a career in nursing attending a highly engaging talk from our former student Kiran whilst Dr Imtiaz-Umer again provided a hugely valuable and much appreciated insight into the life of a GP for our aspiring medical students. With a general election approaching, our Y13 students recently attended a talk from Dr Alen Toplišek, Senior Lecturer in Global Affairs and Politics from the University of Derby, on the UK political system and background to the major current political issues. This event was a follow up the focus students have each year in their Learning for Life sessions. Finally, students have again this term taken part in our very own version of 'Ready Steady Cook', with a 'one-pot challenge'. This hugely popular event was this time won by Keira, Nykera and Merin.

#### What do we do at tutor time?


